## How is it assessed?

Assessment of the learner's ability is a two-step process.

### Unit NGC1

- An open book examination (OBE) to assess what the learner knows; this is scenario based and will include a closing interview, done remotely, where the learner will be asked questions in regards to their submission.

### Unit NGC2:

- A practical risk assessment to evaluate what the learner can do (3 hours). Learners will complete a risk assessment and develop an action plan for their workplace – this is immediately useful and valuable.

## How long does it take?

10 days classroom study, an exam day, closing interview plus personal study time.		
Week 1	NGC1	Monday to Friday (5 days)
Week 2	NGC2	Monday to Friday (5 days)
OBE	NGC1	OBE date set by NEBOSH On the exam day, at 09.00 BST the OBE question paper will be available in the NEBOSH online examination platform. Learners have 24 hours to complete and submit examination.
Within 10 days of completing the NGC1 exam, the learner must submit their completed practical assessment (NGC2).

## What is required to Pass?

The learner will need to successfully pass the OBE (NGC1) and practical assessment (NGC2). Assessments are marked by external examiner appointed by NEBOSH.

## Examination results

Results will be available within 50 days from the date of examination or submission of assignment.
